All of the branch libraries hold collections relating to the local history of their surrounding area. The main Local Studies Department is located in Castlebar Library and is the repository for a wealth of material on the history and heritage of County Mayo from the earliest times to the present.

Mayo County Library has continually acquired and produced material of local interest - books, manuscripts, journals, newspapers, photographs, maps, microfilm etc. The result is an extremely comprehensive collection.



Genealogy

Mayo County Library holds a range of Genealogy records which can assist you with your study. While we do not provide a genealogical service we can offer advice and assistance on how to begin your search. Many resources are now available online:

The Census returns of 1901 and 1911 for every household in Ireland



Property records for all Ireland compiled between 1847 and 1864 are known as Griffith's Valuations. The records for Mayo were compiled c.1855.



The Ordnance Survey Name Books for County Mayo were compiled in 1838. They can be used to find the location together with a brief description of a particular place or townland.



The Tithe Applotment Books were compiled between 1823 and 1837 in order to determine the amount which occupiers of agricultural holdings over one acre should pay in tithes to the Protestant Church. Not all property was to subject to tithes.



Baptismal and marriage records up to the year 1880 for the majority of the Catholic parishes in Ireland have been digitized and are available online from the National Library. These records are in the form of images of the pages in the actual registers and are not indexed.



The records for the parishes in County Mayo have been indexed by the two Mayo Family History Centers and can be searched online. There are charges to access the data but preliminary searches are free.



Headstones in North County Mayo. Photographic catalogues of the legible gravestones from almost every burial ground in north Mayo (79 cemeteries, 22,000 photos). They are free to browse and search.



Details of persons arriving at Ellis Island, New York in the period 1892 to 1924 have been digitized and are available at



General Register Office: civil registration of records of births over 100 years ago, marriages over 75 years ago and deaths over 50 years ago are available at




IGS provide a data recording and mapping service, recording and plotting the details of every grave within a graveyard. The data is displayed on a sign at the graveyard and also online. The site covers numerous graveyards across the county.

Schools' Folklore Collection

The Schools' Scheme of 1937-1938 represented one of the greatest drives ever undertaken in the field of folklore collecting. These records are available online at duchas.ie. Castlebar Library also holds microfilm copies of most of the material collected by schools in County Mayo. The quality and quantity of the material collected by each school varies.

War of Independence





Maps Notes The collection holds a wide range of maps of County Mayo, including the detailed map by William Bald from the early 19th century, numerous Ordnance Survey maps and a selection of estate maps. The online mapping system allows users to search a place and see how it has changed over time.
