URDF Funding – Castlebar Historic Core Reactivation Project.



The Castlebar Historic Core Reactivation project has received approval of ϵ 8.53 million. This is a public realm project that will stimulate regeneration by redressing the deterioration of underutilised historic properties and back lands that frame the Mall, Castlebar's historic urban core.

The project consists of:

- Public realm works in the Mall, to refurbish and rejuvenate its setting and to provide an enhanced connection to other parts of the town, including the Military Barracks and Ellison Street
- Re-purposing the former Daly's (Imperial) Hotel (built circa 1790) as an innovation hub.
- Re-purposing the former Castlebar Post Office (built circa 1904) as a community youth resource centre.
- Master plan and strategic site assembly at key locations in Castlebar.

In addition, The Castlebar Military Barracks Project has received approval of funding of $\textbf{\in 2.5 million}$.

These funding approvals will see in investment of \notin 13.5 million in Castlebar and this funding can be a vehicle for development and growth and an economic stimulus for the County.

Water Services, Environment, Climate Change, Agriculture & Emergency Services

Environment - Climate Action:

- 20 Mayo communities have submitted Expression of interest in becoming Mayo's initial Decarbonising Zone. Workshops with these communities are ongoing and the deadline for submission of application forms is April 16th.
- Climate Leadership training was provided to all Senior Management and Elected Representatives on March 19th as part of the National LASTNG Climate Action Training Plan.
- Mayo Comhairle na nÓg Climate Conversation was held on March 30th as part of the National Climate Dialogue.

Rural Water:

In February 2021, Mayo County Council submitted a report and revised request for funding to the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage for the proposed Murrisk Community Water Connection (CWC). The proposed CWC will supply over 600 houses with drinking water and is estimated to cost just under €6,000,000.00.

- A network upgrade project to the value of €300,000.00 has commenced on the Glencorrib Group Water Scheme.
- A network upgrade project to the value of €100,000.00 has commenced on the Loughnamon GWS to allow for connection to the public water mains and to be Taken in Charge by Irish Water.
- A network upgrade project to the value of €80,000.00 has been completed on the Drum / Binghamstown Group Water Scheme.
- In March 2021, Mayo County Council submitted a report to the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage requesting revised funding of €1,544,757.00 to complete a network upgrade to Cloonmoore / Cloonlavish Group Water Scheme to allow connection to the public mains and to be Taken in Charge by Irish Water.
- Mayo County Council have been selected by the Department as one of eight Local Authorities to take part in a "Stakeholder engagement in a research project on the governance, supervision, funding and future investment needs of the Rural Water Sector." Mayo County Council will be one of the two initial Local Authorities to be involved in the research project.

Emergency Services - Primary School online competition: In what has been a very difficult year for our young children, we recently held an online competition for them with the support and assistance of all national schools, Mayo County Childcare and the preschool providers in the county. Children in various categories were asked to design their own fire engines and we had a lot of fantastic and innovative ideas demonstrated. There were almost 300 entries which made selection of winners very difficult. With the support of Social Media, we were able to show all entries, which have brightened up the walls of HQ for the past 2 weeks, and to publicise the winners online. We were delighted that there was such a huge effort for which we thanked each child who entered with a small Easter treat.

Housing

- Housing Construction/Acquisition Programme 2016-2021
 - Rebuilding Ireland target for Social Housing in Mayo is 708 however Mayo County Council will endeavour to exceed this figure.

Progress on 2016-2021 programme, 566 units have been completed with another 210 in different stages of progress.

HAP and RAS

In March 2021, 20 houses were delivered under the HAP scheme and 3 houses were delivered under the RAS scheme. This gives a total of 2,168 active households supported by RAS and HAP in Mayo at the end of March 2021.

Leasing

In March 2021 under the leasing programme, 2 houses were delivered under LTL. This give a total of 260 households supported under the Leasing Programme in Mayo.

Homelessness

There were 10 homeless presentations in March 2021.

Defective Concrete Blocks Grant Scheme

To date, 79 Stage 1 Confirmation of Eligibility Applications have been received, 70 Stage 1 Confirmation of Eligibility Approvals issued, and 8 Stage 2 Grant Approval applications received.

Heritage

- Local Enterprise Week took place from the 1st 5th March. Spotlight events included Spring Back & Step Forward – building leadership & resilience; Developing your Business Online in a COVID changed world; Smart Tech for Start-Ups and What next for your digital business presence?
- The Student Enterprise Programme County Final took place on the 11th March. Student enterprises from Claremorris, Crossmolina and Ballinrobe will now progress and compete nationally on the 14th of May.
- Brendan Maloney of Skillko, based in Westport, took part in the LITTUS Philadelphia Transatlantic Showcase during St. Patrick's Day week.

Community, Arts, Sports & Childcare

- Project approvals under the Transitional Programme commenced from 1st April 2021. The Programme will bridge the gap between EU LEADER programming periods. The Initial allocation of € 758,279 will support Mayo-led rural development with a key focus on building capacity in communities.
- Allocations have been made under the Covid Emergency Fund round 2. €55,000 has been allocated to groups to adapt their services and operations to fit the new COVID-19 reality and to become more involved in the Government's 'Keep Well' campaign.
- Expressions of Interest have been invited under CLAR 2021. Details available on Mayo.ie
- Mayo Comhairle na nÓg rolled out a National Initiative titled 'Counting with Comhairle'. Approx. 750 young people participated in the initiative.
- "Its for Girls" Teenage Campaign which targets 30 minutes physical activity daily leading up to the Virtual 10K currently has 100 participants.
- As services resume Mayo County Childcare committee offer ongoing support to childcare services throughout the County.
