~~Killala is built on the left bank of the River Moy at Killala Bay. The distance from Sligo is 45 miles; from Castlebar, 31 miles and from Ballina, 8 miles.~~

The town is now devoid of its oldtime industrial and commercial prosperity and during the past thirty years, since the improvements to the channel allowed ships to proceed right upstream to Ballina Quay, the fortunes of Killala have been on the wane. ~~For it was on the boats which called regularly to the little harbour, engaged in trading between here and continental countries that Killala largely depended.~~ At one time too, over three hundred were engaged in fishing but now not a single man in Killala is engaged in this industry. Gone also are the manufactories of linen and other commodities until to-day, Killala is a little town of derelict old warehouses.
