Fellmacentenna, that grim, terrifying chasm en Dewnpatrick Head was the scene of one of the mest tragic occurrences that followed the defeat of the Insurgents of 1798. British seldiers and yeemsnry were scenting the country in blackthirsty columns, seeking out and massacring these who were suspected of fighting and even sympathising with the Insurrectionists. Whilst busy tending their long neglected crops, a band of about thirty men from the Laggan district received but a late warning of the apprench of an English flying column. Enswing well the fate that would be theirs were they to await the arrival of the seldiery, the men sought refuge in the mest dangerous of all hiding places. A strong young woman held a rope by means of which they descended in turn to a ledge of rock below. The wemsn was to return on the departure of the seldiers but being frightened, she fled to the nills and when she did return, long after the appointed time, the incoming tide had trapped the unfortunate men and all had died a most herrible death; the bedies could be seen fleating for below.
