In an effort to increase awareness on the various initiatives that have been introduced by Government to assist with housing delivery an Information Morning was held for Developers and Auctioneers in partnership with Construction Federation Ireland (CFI) on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March in the Regional Training Centre.

The session was used to outline the schemes and assistance available by the State / Mayo County Council in the delivery of new and renovated houses. Presentations were made by Michael Broderick, Chief Executive, First Home Scheme, Justin Molloy, Director, CFI as well presentations by Senior Council Management on Turnkeys, Croí Conaithe, Buy and Renew, Repair and Lease, Part V and Planning.

There was a Q&A session and some feedback to the Department of Housing was relayed on a number of issues. Key contacts in all the relevant schemes were made available to attendees.

# **Housing**

The overall target for Social Housing under Housing For All is 730 up to 2026. The target for 2022 was 90 units, 91 was provided. The 2023 target is 151 units and projects are currently underway to meet this target. We currently have approval for 13 houses in Westport for Affordable Housing and are looking at a number of options throughout the County.
