I continue to meet and collaborate with the HSE and An Gardai Siochana on a weekly basis and the Council will continue to support the HSE public health messages and encourage everyone to stay-at-home and reduce all social contacts.

#### Housing

Housing Construction/Acquisition Programme 2016-2021

• Rebuilding Ireland target for Social Housing is 708 however Mayo County Council will endeavour to exceed this figure. Progress on 2016-2021 programme, 564 units have been completed with another 210 in different stages of progress.

#### **HAP and RAS**

In January 2021, 20 houses were delivered under the HAP scheme and 5 houses delivered under the RAS scheme. 2,161 active households supported by RAS and HAP in Mayo at the end January 2021.

#### Leasing

In January 2021 under the leasing programme 3 houses were delivered. A total of 255 households supported under the Leasing Programme in Mayo.

#### **Refugee Resettlement**

This phase of the Refugee Resettlement Programme is completed, and the resettlement target has been achieved. There are 200 persons accommodated in Mayo to date (186 Mayo County Council, 14 persons accommodated by the Red Cross in pledged accommodation). We are awaiting a national decision regarding Phase 2 of the programme.
