#### PARISH NEWS

#### VOCATIONS SUNDAY:

Today is Vocations Sunday when we are asked to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. People are asking what is going to happen to the Church in the diocese and in our parish if the shortage of vocations continues. In contrast to the shortage of vocations in Ireland vocations world-wide were never so numerous. Some priests from abroad are already working in parts of the country and it seems more will have to be looked for in the future.

The clearest aspect of God's call in Ireland today is the responsibility Jesus gives to us all in Baptism for the maintenance and future of the church in our own parish. The Parish Pastoral Council is the means specifically designed to give people the opportunity to fulfil this responsibility. Full-time shepherds will always be needed. We pray that young men will respond generously to this special call. We have two students for the diocese at present. One man is due to be ordained in the near future. The second man has only began his studies.

#### FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

- **Monday:** 1<sup>st</sup> May St. Joseph the Worker. This feast was instituted to remind us of the dignity of human labour and to encourage us to place our work under the patronage of St. Joseph who was himself a tradesman.
- **Tuesday:** St. Athanasius, bishop and doctor of the Church (298-373). He was bishop of Alexandria in Egypt for 45 years but spent 17 of them in exile for defending the divinity of Jesus Christ against the Arian heresy.
- Wednesday: St Philip and St. James, apostles. Philip was born in Bethsaida. He asked to see Jesus and having met Him identified Him to others. James was son of Alphaeus and a cousin of Jesus. He became bishop of Jerusalem, wrote one of the Epistles and led a life of penance. He was martyred in 62 AD.
- **Thursday: St. Conleth, bishop.** He was said to be from Wicklow. He was living as a hermit when St. Bridget persuaded him to come and be chaplain for her community in Kildare. He is buried beside her in the great church there.
- Friday: Blessed Edmund Rice, religious (1762-1844). He came from Callan, Co. Kilkenny. After the early death of his young wife he sold his possessions and spent the rest of his life educating the poor. With other like-minded men he founded the Irish Christian Brothers.
