

ADVENT:

The First Sunday of Advent is the first day of the Church's new liturgical year. During the coming year the whole of Christ's life will be put before us in the various seasons celebrated by the Church. The Good News of Christ's teaching will be read for us at Mass each Sunday. During Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ who is the fulfilment of all our hopes and dreams. Advent looks forward also to Christ's second coming (as it does today) when God's plan of salvation will reach its complete fulfilment. We are told in today's Gospel to 'stay awake' and 'stand ready' for the final judgement that can come at any moment.

ADVENT WREATH:

The Advent Wreath is one of the strongest symbols of Advent. It holds four candles, a purple one for each of three Sundays of Advent and a pink one for the third Sunday of Advent. The circular wreath of evergreen leaves is a sign of God's loving care which is unending. The evergreen branches suggest the faithfulness of God which is always alive and fresh.

Tommie Duggan on behalf of Fahy Development Committee will light the first candle on the Advent Wreath at 8.00pm Mass in Fahy.

Una O'Malley on behalf of the Parish Pastoral Council will light the first candle on the Advent Wreath at the 11.30am Mass in Myna.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

- Monday: Saint John of Damascus; also known as John Damascene was a Syrian monk and priest. Born and raised in Damascus, he died on December 4, 749 AD.
- Wednesday: St. Nicholas, bishop. He was bishop of Myra in the fourth century in Turkey. A legend says he gave dowries to a poor man's three daughters. Santa Claus derives from this story. He is patron saint of Russia and Galway.
- **Thursday: St. Ambrose, bishop (339-397).** He was Roman governor of the province of Milan when the people elected him as their bishop although he was not yet baptised. He became a brilliant preacher and powerful defender of Church teaching in his writings
- Friday: Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a *holday of obligation.*


