

PARISH NEWS

SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD:

In instituting this third Sunday as the Sunday of the Word of God on 30th September 2019 Pope Francis said "the relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believes and Sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who opens our minds to them it is impossible to understand the scriptures in depth. Yet the contrary is equally true; without the scriptures the events of the mission of Jesus and of his church in the world would remain incomprehensible". St. Jerome rightly said: "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ".

ST. MATTEW'S GOSPEL:

The semi-continuous reading of St. Matthew's Gospel on each Sunday begins today with the calling of the first disciples. It seems the author was a Greek-speaking Christian scribe writing between 80 and 90 AD. He emphasizes more than the other Gospel writers how Jesus was the Jewish Messiah descended from King David, how he opposed the Pharisees as "hypocrites" and emphasised a "righteousness" that goes beyond that of the Jewish leaders of the day. He portrays Jesus as the one who fulfils the law and the Prophets and calls on his followers to spread the good news not only among the Jews but also to Gentiles of all nations.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

Tuesday: St. Francis de Sales, bishop, and doctor of the church (1567-

1622). He was bishop of Geneva. He founded the Visitation Sisters. He worked with gentleness and love to rebuild the Catholic faith after

the Reformation.

Wednesday: The Conversion of St. Paul, apostle. He preached the power of

God working in the life of each of us. His own conversion showed that out of a persecutor God made a preacher and teacher of

peoples out of a persecutor of Christians.

Thursday: Sts. Timothy & Titus, bishops. They were disciples and helpers of

St. Paul. The New Testament has letters St. Paul wrote to each of them. Timothy was the first bishop of Ephesus and Titus was bishop

of Crete.

Friday: St. Angela Merici (1474-1540). She founded the Ursuline Sisters.

She immersed herself in Christian education based on love, kindness

with firmness and concern for the individual.

Saturday: St. Thomas Aquinas, priest and doctor of the church (1224-

1274). He was born in Italy and was probably the greatest

theologian of all time and was known as 'the angelic doctor'.
