#### Ronaldo

Our mass servers are the best but we still have a few small 'rules'! Four to be precise; try not to talk, try not to fidget, try to have a 'holy' face on and last but not least; never to wear a Manchester United jersey to Mass. The last one is for my benefit! Being a supporter of the other team in red I try to avoid everything Man Utd – especially on weekends when we lose and they win! That last rule often leads to a bit of fun and banter in the sacristy before Mass.

In recent weeks it has been hard to avoid news of one red; Ronaldo. I have to admit that I am not his greatest fan, but last week I came across a video he did which has given me second thoughts.

The video is set in Madrid. Ronaldo is made-up to look like a tramp, with a scruffy beard and hair, and he wears a body suit to make him look heavy and out of shape. He goes to the central square in Madrid with a football, places a small cardboard box in front of him and performs tricks with the ball for the passing crowds. The crowds pass him by without even a sideward glance, nobody notices him, except to avoid and walk around him. Then Ronaldo changes tack. He tries to engage the passers-by by kicking to ball to them in the hope that they will pass it back. Most just step over the ball, some pass it back but then quickly walk on.

Finally, after over an hour of being ignored, a young boy, of about 10, passed the ball back to Ronaldo and looked for a return. They began to play together and, like children do, spent the next five minutes dodging in and around the hurried pedestrians and playing ball with each other.

The video finishes with Ronaldo revealing his identity to the awestruck boy and presenting the signed ball to him. Within seconds Ronaldo is surrounded by a frenzied mass of people holding cameras aloft. Everyone wants to get close to him to such an extent that security has to step in. The little boy meanwhile simply walks away with the ball under his arm, quietly smiling to himself.

Ronaldo's video teaches us a lot about ourselves; how quick we are to judge people by their appearances, how in the 'busyness' of our lives we can often miss the important bits, how children can teach us about life.

In these days leading up to Christmas our attention will be drawn to many things. Shiny packaging will try to lure us into buying the latest must-have Christmas items, subtle marketing will tempt us into believing that Christmas couldn't possibly be Christmas without us having a particular item, well focused advertising will try to convince our children (and us) that Christmas is all about them. We won't have time to notice the humble old crib standing in the town square. The incessant hum of 'Christmas music' will drown out the words of the Christmas carol and the birth of the Christ child over 2000 years ago will be forgotten amid the wrapping paper and the presents. Sometimes we get sucked in and get so caught up in our busyness that we miss the important bits.

Sometimes it takes the innocence of a child to see beyond outward appearances. At Christmas we need to rediscover that child in ourselves so that we might see beyond the tinsel and wrapping paper. Despite the video I won't be buying a red No7 shirt
