## FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

Monday: St. Finbarr, bishop. He was born in Bandon. He founded a

monastery at the mouth of the river Lee which became a famous

centre of learning.

Tuesday: Sts. Cosmas and Damien, martyrs. They were born in Arabia and

studied medicine in Syria. They were excellent doctors and set up practice in Cilicia. They didn't charge those who were poor. They

were martyred under the emperor Diocletian.

Wednesday: St. Vincent de Paul, priest (1580-1660). In 1625 he

founded the Vincentians to look after the spiritual needs of the poor and to train students for the priesthood. He also founded the

Sisters of Charity to work with the sick.

**Thursday:** Saint Wenceslaus- The first Czech saint and the patron saint of the Czech state, Wenceslas (Václav in Czech) served as duke of

Bohemia from 921 until his death. He built numerous churches in Bohemia and was deeply respected as a pious, moral, educated, and intelligent man who promoted the Christian faith and took care of the poor, the sick, the widowed, and the orphaned by doing charitable deeds. He even founded the rotunda of Saint Vitus at

Prague Castle.

Friday: Sts. Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, archangels. Gabriel

brought God's message about the Incarnation to Mary at the Annunciation. Raphael was guide to Tobias in the Old Testament. Michael is venerated as 'captain of the heavenly host' and

protector of Christians in general.

Saturday: St. Jerome, priest and doctor of the church (348-420).

He translated the Bible into Latin and wrote commentaries
