GLENCORRIB MAN PATRICK MORAN WINS BRONZE M65 IN BRITISH PENTATHLON CHAMPIONSHIPS

British Outdoor the Masters Pentathlon Championships hosted by Oxford City AC at Horspath on Sunday 8th May 2022, Mayo AC was represented by Glencorrib man Patrick Moran. Patrick has competed successfully in various combined events championships over the years as well as National Masters indoors and outdoors. He is also a member of the club sprint relay squad who welcome new members to develop and compete over the summer. Now competing in the M65 category, he travelled to Oxford to compete in the five track and field events which make up the outdoor pentathlon - long jump, javelin, 200 metres, discus and 1500 metres. Points are accumulated according to performance in each of these disciplines during the course of an afternoon.

In 2017 Patrick competed in these Championships as M60 and won bronze with 2278 points. His 2022

His 2022 details: Long jump 3.23, Javelin 21.65, 200 metres 33.99, Discus 22.08, 1500 metres 6.51. These include M65 pbs for long jump, javelin, and 200 metres. He says "it was a long day, check in at 9am and our last event at 5pm. Mercury hit 22°C after 12pm – very hot in Oxford. I did my best to keep hydrated. It was a very well run event. Guests are treated same as British athletes and receive deserved medals". Hearty congratulations to Patrick winning bronze M65 having accumulated 2033 points. 


PAINTING OF CLARE **AND COMPANION** on auction for Ukrainian refugees in Ireland has sold for €11,000 (£9,300), nearly 30 times the starting price. It is one of 600 lots being auctioned from Clonliffe. Clonliffe has also been approved to house 150 Ukrainian refugees, due to move in over the next four weeks.

RELIC OF BLESSED JERZY POPIELUSZKO has been stolen. Α reliquary containing the relic had been given to Nicholas Church in Boston by a parish member. The Polish priest and supporter of the Solidarity trade union movement was kidnapped in October 1984 by three state security police officers. After being severely beaten he was then dumped, with a



stone tied to his feet, into the Vistula Water Reservoir, west of Warsaw. His body was later recovered and thousands including leader Lech Walesa attended his funeral. His killers and their superior officer were later jailed for his death.
