#### **A Faulty Socket**

How often do you switch on or off lights? How many times a day do you 'throw on' the kettle or charge the phone? As you sit reading this piece the radio might be on in the background or the telly silently keeping you company.

Luckily enough we don't experience power outages too often these days but when we do, for me at least, they come as a shock to the system. Suddenly I find myself in total darkness. Once I get over the inclination to get up and switch on the lights, I usually go looking for the candles. Delighted to have found them I quickly realise that I now need to find a lighter or matches, which always prove much more elusive. At the end of my tether, I come up with the bright idea that I can get a light from the grill on the cooker – my cooker is electric! By the time (if) I do eventually get the candles lit its time to sit down and have a cuppa – only to remember that the kettle is electric! So there I sit, in semi darkness and in chilly silence waiting for the power to come back on.

Although built just over 100 years ago now, when the Parish Church opened there was no such thing as electricity. It's hard to imagine people gathering in the semi darkness of a candle lit church, or indeed the effort which would have gone into the lighting of candles. There would have been no amplification so it would have been almost impossible to hear the priest (perhaps not a bad thing!) as he prayed the Mass in Latin. At least parishioners weren't too cold; there was a furnace under the tower which burnt coal and turf (the chimney is still used for the modern-day boiler and is built into the tower wall). On that point its interesting to note that when the church was built local families were expected to donate £5 towards the cost, part of which they could pay by donating a cartload of turf!

No one is quite sure when electricity was first used to light and heat the Parish Church but more than likely it was sometime between 1937 and 1938 when electricity first came to Newport. We can just imagine the excitement as people came to see the

church all lit up with the 'electric light' and to hear the organ which up to that point had been powered by a bellows system.

Since the first connection with the national grid the parish church has enjoyed the benefits of electricity for over 90 years. In those years how often have we switched on the lights and heat, listened to the organ or, in more recent times, live streamed our Masses without giving the electricity behind the switch a second thought? And we probably would have continued not paying the least interest in the source of power for the church if it wasn't for someone spotting a 'faulty' socket just two weeks ago.

All power coming into the church comes via one underground cable, and up until this week that cable was the original cable which first brought power into the church almost 90 years ago. Over that time it had carried a lot more power that it was originally designed to take. That one 'faulty' socket pointed to a much bigger problem. The cable had deteriorated to such an extent that it was no longer capable of carrying electricity into the church. Impossible to repair it has now been replaced by a brand-new cable. Crisis averted. Power restored. Beats sitting in the dark!
