Phoning Home

My niece recently went to her first concert in Dublin. She and her friends travelled up and down from Galway by special bus to see Billie Eilish. It was a big moment for both my niece and for her mother, but any stress involved was greatly minimised by the availability and use of the mobile phone. Both my niece and her mother were never more than a phone call away from each other and the night was punctuated with frequent calls and texts back and forth.

The experience reminded me of my first time being away from home.

My mother being a Kilkenny woman by birth meant that as children we spent much of our summer holidays visiting our Kilkenny cousins. On one such Summer it was decided that I would be allowed to wait on with my grandaunt for a few weeks on my own. At this remove it seems as though I spent the entire summer with my grandaunt but it reality I imagine that I was there on my own no more than two or three weeks. What I do remember clearly are my twice weekly phone callshome.

It was a time before mobile phones and, not unusual for that time, my aunt had no phone in her house, so twice a week we'd make the short journey into town where I would ring home from the phone box. For a young boy of 10 making a call from a phone box was a very intricate affair indeed. In fact, it was an ordeal: first you had to line up your saved up coins, then you'd ring the operator and when she was ready you'd insert the coins and press button A, when the call was put through and answered you would be asked to press button B which released the coins into the coin box and allowed you three minutes of talking time. A lot could go wrong; there might be a queue for the phone, it could take an age for the operator to answer (if at all), the coins might be rejected, either button might get stuck, coins accepted by A could be coughed up by B meaning you were back to square one, and to top it all off, even when the coins were accepted the operator might forget to put you through, or cut you off early, at which point you'd have to start again at the beginning and do your best to explain your case to the new operator.

Added to the technical problems which I encountered, I had the aditional complication that for me ringing home meant ringing a shop. If the shop was busy the phone might not be answered at all, and sometimes even when answered dad would be too busy and mam mightn't be there, meaning that all the effort was for naught. The disappointment of having to wait for another three days for the opportunity to ring again was immense, but equally, the sheer joy and excitement of a successful phone call was unconfined.

I sometimes give out about our overdependence on the mobile phone. Betraying my age, I lament the fact that our children spend so much time with their heads in their phones, or living in the parallel universe of TikTok, Instagram or Facebook. That is only half the story.

It's lovely to see the peace and ease which the mobile phone gives to both children and their parents. That 10 year old boy of yesteryear could have done with one!
