St Vincent de Paul

On Monday last our parish St Vincent de Paul marked its 40th anniversary with a celebratory Mass attended by local members along with representatives from Westport and Louisburgh.

The first meeting of St Bridget's Conference took place in Newport on 30th August 1982. At the invitation of Canon Moran a group of nine volunteers met to form the first gathering - five of that original group are sadly no longer with us but happily two are still active members of our local Conference.

Although we marked the 40th Anniversary of St Bridget's Conference here in Newport last week and I have spent the past 8 years as Spiritual Director, the St Vincent de Paul has been a part of my life since my childhood. My mam was a long-time member in Westport and for as far back as I can remember Monday night in our house was St Vincent de Paul night for us growing up. We looked forward to St Vincent de Paul night because it was the night when dad was in charge, and we were allowed to stay up for Hawaii Five 0!

Of course the St Vincent de Paul wasn't just for one night of the week and in those days it wasn't just about going out to visit others either. Over the years our kitchen at home was a haven or welcome and security for many a caller down on their luck. Witnessing in our home that Vincentian care for the needy and respect for the most vulnerable is something which has deeply influenced my life ever since.

Although last week we remembered in gratitude the names of the founding members of Newport St Vincent de Paul we will never know the names nor the needs of the 100's of ordinary people which St Bridget's Conference has helped over the past 40 years. Some of those helped would have found themselves in a lifelong cycle of need or poverty, others would have had periods of crisis through which they managed to navigate with the help of the St Vincent de Paul, and yet others would have had once off occasions when they found themselves lost and in need of support. The support

offered to all, whether it financial, material or simply emotional, was always deeply human and profoundly respectful.

The care, respect and sensitivity with which the St Vincent de Paul quietly goes about its work is something which is truly inspiring. It doesn't matter who is in need or what the need is - help is always given in a way which honours the dignity and confidentiality of the person or family in crisis. The Vincentian charism which inspires and informs everything the St Vincent de Paul Society does is rooted in faith. It is an attitude of faith which allows us to see Jesus in the poor, in the homeless in the most vulnerable of our society. When we have the opportunity to help another, we are afforded the privilege of helping Jesus. We do not do it for him, we do it to him.

In celebrating our local St Vincent de Paul Conference, we are in fact celebrating and acknowledging the extraordinary generosity of this community. Without the ongoing local support for its work the St Vincent de Paul Society would not be able to help those most in need. Thank you.
