Learning

The closing of the school year for sixth class pupils is usually marked by a graduation service/celebration. Sometimes the celebration takes the form of a Mass but often the element of prayer and blessing forms part of broader celebration of their time in primary school. It's always a lovely occasion with lots of smiling children and very proud parents. This year was no exception.

Although I was sorry to have to miss one of our school's graduations this year I did feel a particular bond with the cohort of children who graduated because they had begun their primary school journey 8 years ago, the year I arrived in Burrishoole. Over that time it was a joy to watch them grow and develop into the fine young boys and girls they have become and it was a privilege to get to know them so well, first of all in the Good News Club, then as they prepared to receive their Communion Holy and make Confirmation and in more recent years as many of them served Mass.

This year's graduation ceremonies were different however in one major respect. Often at the end of the evening a slide show is shown of pictures of the children as they progressed through their time in school. It's lovely to see the children grow and develop, but this year the slideshows were somewhat different. Just over three years ago new faces began to appear – first one, then two, then many. The slideshow chronicled the arrival of children from Ukraine.

At first those faces were sad and lost – the children confused and broken, but overtime those faces transformed into beaming and smiling beacons of joy. What a change... slowly those children were able to leave behind the sadness and trauma of home as they grew in trust and confidence and became at one with their classmates.

As I marvelled at the transformation of those children and the wonderful work our schools have done in integrating them into the classes I couldn't help but remember some of the children who have

made their way to our parish and our schools seeking refuge. The little girl who was afraid of me simply because I was a strange man and her experience had taught her to fear all men, the boy from Bucha who arrived so traumatised that he had become non-verbal, the 14-year-old teenager who had been sent by his parents to mind his granny who had come to Ireland and she without a word of English. All beautiful children carrying huge burdens of loss and distress.

By year end there were over 40 Ukrainian children attending our local schools. There they found a refuge and sanctuary from the displacement and turmoil which they have suffered. Each of them carries with them their own trauma – the extent of that trauma we will never know, but this is now home for them. Our children have welcomed them with open arms and hearts, our schools have created a safe and secure place for them.

The end of year graduation ceremonies celebrate the boys ang girls of 6th class. Over the past 8 years they have learnt a lot, but their warmth and welcome for their new classmates can teach us a lot.
