

KILL ABBEY: Murgagagh Abbey is only a short distance from the village Shrule. This ruinous abbey and graveyard is also known as 'Killeenbrenan of the Virgin' and 'Kille Abbey'. Many aspects of the history of Murgagagh have been forgotten but we do know that it was founded around 1428 on the site of an earlier church. The abbey was possibly the first and most important houses of the Third Order of St Francis to be established in Ireland, and was built with the help of the De Burgo family.

The order is thought to have been established by St Francis himself for married men and women who wished for a Franciscan life. Murgagagh Abbey is a beautiful place to visit and we are having an information meeting on what will be happening over the next few months on how to maintain the site etc. The meeting will take place in Shrule Hall on Monday 21st





He was 193 and his name was Miles from Dublin






