FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

Tuesday: St. Laurence O'Toole, bishop. Before being appointed Archbishop

of Dublin in 1162 he was abbot of Glendalough Monastery. He returned to Ireland as Papal Legate in 1179 after the Third Lateran Council. He died in Normandy in 1180 seeking to make peace

between Henry 11 and the Irish Kings.

Wednesday: St. Albert the Great, bishop and doctor of the Church (1206-

1280). He was a Dominican theologian who taught in Cologne. He was called "The Universal Teacher" for the vast range of his

interests.

Thursday: St. Margaret of Scotland.

Friday: St. Elizabeth of Hungary, religious (1207-1231). She was queen at 14 years, widowed and exiled at 20 and dead at 24. She was a

woman of prayer and service of the poor.
