Easter Dues envelopes are now available at the back of the church for those who do not use the envelope system. If you are using the envelopes available at church, and are planning to apply for charity tax rebate, please write your name and envelope number on envelope.

What are Dues Envelopes? The Easter Dues envelopes along with Christmas and Autumn Dues pay the salary of the priest of the parish, diocesan levy (calculated by curate's salary) and contribute to the support of retired clergy, clergy working in offices and clergy in underprivileged areas of the diocese. The current salary for the priest of the diocese is $\leq 1,450$ per calendar month. **What is the Weekly Offertory Collection for then?** It is a common misunderstanding that the weekly offertory collection is for the priest. In actually fact, the weekly offertory collections is for the parish. It does not form any part of the priest's income or salary. A few moments into giving his Easter Sunday Urbi et Orbi address the Pope paused and sat down. At the end, he stood up again give the blessing. to Throughout the Triduum Vatican made the the arrangements necessary so that Francis, whose sever e leg pain is causing

him mobility problems, could take part in the liturgies. Francis is showing himself ready to adapt his ministry to his physical limitations. On Holy Thursday he washed the feet of 12 prisoners in Civitavecchia who sat on a raised platform so he did not have to kneel down, while Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re, the Dean of the College of Cardinals, presided at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening in St Peter's, with the Pope giving the homily while sitting.

Although Francis now struggles to stand and walk, he is not slowing down. He refuses to take days off and on the afternoon of Easter Monday; he was out in St Peter's Square again for a meeting with around 80,000 Italian teenagers.



GALWAY CELEBRATES THE CONSECRATION OF A NEW BISHOP

This weekend Bishop Michael Duignan will take up the reins as bishop of Galway in addition to his job as Bishop of Clonfert (ie. Loughrea, Ballinasloe & Portumna areas). A bit of consolidation has taken place in the area of local church governance and management and that's no harm. We welcome him with open arms and pray God blessing upon him. He will be the "Managing Director" for the Catholic Church in the area - 38 parishes in Galway and 24 in Clonfert - a total of about 150,000 people.

I don't know to man personally but he seems to be a very personable able energetic man. He has been Bishop of Clonfert since 2019 and is well liked. He was born in Athlone, in 1970, the eldest of six siblings. He was ordained as a priest for the Diocese of Elphin on 17 July 1994, He seems a modern man for modern times and we look forward to his guidance and inspiration. Society in general needs inspirational leaders and we trust our new Bishop



will be one. A couple of years ago he wrote the following piece about being a Bishop in today's Ireland which gives us a flavour about his approach.

"One of the good things about studying theology is that you study the history of the Church. It gives you a good insight into the changes that have occurred down through the centuries. Soon you realise that the Church has always faced difficulties and challenges. Some of those challenges make the challenges that we have today seem small indeed. However, we do face challenges and the next few years will bring significant changes to our church communities. Falling numbers participating in the life of our parishes coupled with a lack of finances and resources along with a lack of clergy will not be without consequences. I take solace from a belief that God never abandons his people.

On the flip side of every challenge there lies an opportunity. With the help of the Holy Spirit, my hope would be that we, the laity, priests and bishop, together can work out new structures and new ways of doing things that will be more suitable to the situation we find ourselves in. Please God this will allow us to move from spending a lot of our time propping up things that are eventually going to fall down to a situation where the Church, although reduced in number, can better live and share the joy of Christian faith - especially with our young people and those on the margins of the Church and society". We wish to congratulate the 9 candidates from St. Joseph's NS, Shrule who received their first Holy Communion this weekend, Saturday 30th April 2022. We thank their parents, teachers, Fr. Vivian and everyone who helped out. Many blessings to our First Communicants and their families. How wonderful it is to be able to receive the Holy Eucharist to be nourished and encouraged on the path of Christian discipleship.

Over a hundred years ago, a little girl in northern France made her first communion. She had prepared for it; she had looked

forward to it with excitement. And the day finally came. This is how she described the first time she received Jesus. "I felt that I was loved, and I said to Jesus, 'I love you and I give myself to you forever...' "It was a fusion: Jesus and I were no longer two, I had vanished in him as a drop of water vanishes in the ocean. Jesus alone remained." She ended her description of her first communion by recalling the joy she felt that day – and the joy she experienced every time she received Christ in the Eucharist.

Today that little girl is one of the most famous saints in the Catholic Church – St Therese of Lisieux. She illustrates that joy flows from the certainty of being infinitely loved by God. And every time we receive the Eucharist, we receive a living reminder of God's love for us.



We too can say: "I know that I am loved. And that certainty brings a joy that nothing can take away, because I am safe in the hands of Jesus."

I would like to thank everyone who prepared these boys and girls to receive their first Holy Communion. I would also like to remind the parents of children that it is how you live and how you practice your faith in the family that is going to influence your children. Hence, continue training them in the Christian faith and its practice, not by advice but by exemplary Christian lives.
