I remember when she was born. I remember how the phone rang as dad was getting us ready for school and someone from the hospital told us that we had a new sister. Probably because she was the youngest, and the last, I remember the excitement of the day she was brought home and I remember too her first day at school. And now she – the baby, is celebrating a significant roundy birthday!

For so long the youngest of the family has always been that – the youngest. It was never a question of age, it was more a coincidence of birth. Age never even came into it – being the baby meant you always were, and would forever be, the baby of the family. But now as she reaches that significant milestone it seems as if not only has she aged but that her aging has aged all of us! Suddenly we are all older.

Life and the passing of time can do that to us – before we know it life can slip by, and I suppose that's why it's important to mark and to celebrate milestones along the way.

When it comes to our faith journey however the milestones marking the way run out very quickly. We don't celebrate the anniversary of our Baptism or of our First Communion. As we begin Lent can I encourage you to make Lent 2023 a milestone in your journey of faith. Be intentional in how you live. Use these days to nourish your faith. Find moments of quiet for yourself, be attentive to God's presence, listen to what God is saying to you, seek out God in the bits and pieces of everyday and most of all allow God find you.

Time has a way of slipping by. We need moments to stop and to reflect and to celebrate. We need milestones to mark the journey. Will this Lent be your next faith milestone?
