

Lenten Reflection - What Needs Changing in My Life?

We start to come to know that by asking for help. "Lord, help me to know what needs changing." It is often said, "Be careful about what you ask for." This is one of those requests that God must surely want to answer. Then, we have to listen. With a little bit of reflection, most of us will just begin to "name" things that make up our ordinary habits and ways of being who we are, that we aren't very proud of. Things we do and things we never get around to doing. We can "feel" the call to change our attitudes, our self-absorption, or our way of interacting with others. Perhaps a spouse, a loved one, a friend, a family member, a co-worker has told me something about myself that gets in the way of communication, that makes relating to them

difficult. Maybe I don't take God very seriously. I go to Church on Sunday, and contribute my share, but I don't really take time to deal with my relationship with God. Perhaps I've let my mind and fantasy get cluttered with escapist litter. I might begin to name a number of self-indulgent habits. I may realize I rarely, if ever, hear the cry of the poor, and can't remember when I've answered that cry. It could be that dishonesty on all kinds of levels has become a way of life. One of the roadblocks in my relationship with God and others may be deep wounds or resentments from the past, things I continue to hold against others or myself.

HELLO HEADFORD HOW ARE YOU? is a simple yet effective mental health promotion campaign developed by Mental Health Ireland, that encourages people to say 'Hello' and ask 'How, Are You?' The concept of the Hello, How are you? Campaign is to ask with meaning, and to really listen to the person's response. The campaign breaks down the steps: H.E.L.L.O.(H: Hello E: Engage L: Listen L: Learn and O: Options) which supports people to reach out, say hello and ask how are you? On Thursday 30th March Solas Family Resource Centre invite all to join us for a cup of tea/coffee, a chat and a bit of banter. The event hopes to create a greater awareness and understanding of mental health. Help increase confidence in starting conversations about mental health in all settings

A Word in your ear...

What is the most elusive element in human experience? It seems we might have this happiness thing all wrong! If I could promise you greater happiness this very day, would you be interested? What is happiness? At some point in life - probably when we are just old enough to understand the concept of objectives and goals, we're taught that happiness is something to strive for. Furthermore, it is tied up in the milestones of life, like getting that promotion, making a lot of money, graduating from college, getting married, having children, and so on.

Perhaps it's wealth? Health? Success? A smile from someone you love? Should governments pursue 'happiness policies?' Is happiness objective or subjective? Time was, when fortune was measured in terms of enough to eat and a roof over your head. Now it seems to come down to feelings.

But can happiness be measured? At least some academics believe it can. Not just that: they claim to have measured it comprehensively. The 10th World Happiness Report, published this week, was conducted by two academics from the London School of Economics and Columbia University. They interviewed over 100,000 people in 137 countries. They found that, despite global economic slump and nearly seven million deaths from Covid, we are on average just as happy as before the pandemic.

So who is happiest then? For the fifth year in a row, Finland remains at the top of the ranking, and Denmark remains at number two, while all five of the Nordic countries remain amongst the top eight countries. Obviously if you lost someone to Covid you won't score the same as someone who prefers to work from home. And critics have suggested the parameters may not be clearly defined and some people's happiness could be at the expense of others. But caveats notwithstanding, there are interesting findings. "Despite the magnitude of suffering and damage done in Ukraine", the Report says, "benevolence scored record levels as did donations and helping strangers."

The first 'Happiness Report' was published in 2013. With each report since, 'happiness' has grown in importance and is increasingly viewed as integral to a good life. Across social and public discourse: in books, research, and government policy initiatives, the prominence of happiness as an indicator of progress is finding greater acceptance. It has already surpassed GDP and economic growth, both of which are in decline as key indicators of societal welfare. Both documenting and contributing to this growing interest in happiness, the World Happiness Report has and will continue to play an essential role in achieving happier societies.

But one thing seems axiomatic. Throughout Judeo-Christian scripture, blessing is associated with walking with God, with justice, with doing right by others. This also emerged from the latest Happiness Report. It reports: "The undoubted pains of recent years were offset by increases in being able to discover and share the capacity to care for each other in difficult times." Apparently, concern for the neighbour is a fairly essential ingredient in our own personal happiness. Where did we hear that before? So here's the promise: do a kind deed for your neighbour today and you will go to bed tonight a happier person. So happiness is not that elusive after all.


