JUST A THOUGHT:

From the mid-19th to the mid-20th century, a succession of English-speaking intellectuals converted to Catholicism, among them some familiar figures: John Henry Newman, G. K. Chesterton, Graham Greene, Evelyn Waugh, and Thomas Merton. In the days when religion formed a central element in popular culture, these conversions made headline news. It was seen as 'serious stuff'. But not all conversions are explicitly religious. So, what makes a person who has strong opinions change their mind?

This week I read the obituary of a man I had never heard of before, Ray Hill. As a young man he got caught up in right wing politics and became anti-Semitic and racist, eventually joining the neo Nazi movement. Then he did a dramatic turn around. He realised he had gone terribly wrong and, to make amends, he became a mole in the organisation. He exposed their secret activities to the public gaze, thereby rendering them ridiculous and virtually ineffective. Of course in the process he risked how own life on several occasions.




What was so instructive were the two experiences that led to this 'conversion'. Although his wife Glennis, whom he married in 1966,

tolerated his political involvement, his arrest for riotous behaviour and actual bodily harm in 1969 led to their decision to emigrate to South Africa. On arrival there, Hill resumed his extreme political activities. He and his young family soon fell on hard times, and they were looked after by kind Jewish families, with whom he remained life-long friends. The second experience was even more influential: he saw a totally destitute Indian family being turned out of their home with their few possessions, which he realised, was the result of his activities. These two experiences totally changed him.

To be open to change we have to be willing to question the assumptions of the groups to which we belong. BBC radio recently broadcast a wonderful play called 'Cancelling Socrates.' The subject matter is the greatest questioner of all, Socrates of Athens. The play is obviously directed to the cancel culture of our own time, when some people simply refuse to hear certain points of view, blocking their ears and minds. Socrates was condemned to death. And what was his offence? Simply asking questions about the values we should live by, the assumptions of the society to which we belong, and ourselves.

A parallel is often drawn between the death of Socrates and that of Jesus. Socrates posed questions in philosophical form; Jesus told stories and asked people to reflect on where they stood in relation to them. Who did they identify with in the stories? He challenged people to see themselves they are and, to use the old word 'repent'. Unfortunately, the true meaning of the word 'repent' has been lost in translation. People think of it as forcing them to feel bad about themselves when they feel nothing of the sort. But the Greek word suggests it is about re-orientating our lives. For Jesus this was a re-orientation to what he called the kingdom of God. He invited people to be the kind of people who would be at home in this Kingdom. In a secular context, it means asking questions about what we live by, and rethinking our lives towards what, in our best moments, we want to be.




