Praying for a new Archbishop

Last April our Archbishop, Michael Neary, having reached his 75th birthday offered his resignation to the Vatican in Rome. This will have come as no surprise to Rome as all Bishops are required to resign on reaching 75. Now, six months later, we are still awaiting the appointment of his successor. As the peculiarly secretive and long drawn-out process of choosing a new Archbishop of Tuam trundles on, the names of various likely candidates have begun to emerge. The most likely candidates it would seem are serving Bishops who already have some episcopal experience (that counts me out!).

Inevitably, when local clergy meet the attributes of possible candidates are discussed but because for the most part, we have never met any of the candidates any discussion will usually take place in a vacuum.

The role of Archbishop is an unenviable one. When Fr Michael Neary became Archbishop of Tuam more than 25 years ago there was over 120 diocesan priests in full time ministry, today there are 47. The next Archbishop of Tuam will preside over a Church and a diocese coping with huge change. Where once the church was at the centre of the community now it is very much on the periphery, where once it spoke from a position of authority now it is one voice among many, and where once it engendered respect now it is often the subject of suspicion and distrust.

In recent weeks, while names continue to do the rounds, I have taken time to consider not so much who I would like as Archbishop but rather what qualities I would like to see in our next Archbishop. We seek a kindly shepherd who cares for his priests and his people. First and foremost, he must be a person of deep, personal faith. Rather than know about Jesus he must know and experience the Risen Jesus in his daily life. Inspired by faith he will be grounded in pastoral concern and have a humility born from his experience of failure as much as from his awareness of his own need for God's mercy. Motivated and enthused by his love for the Gospel

he will be a man of vision and courage, never afraid to preach, teach and live the Kingdom values of truth, justice, peace and love - even when it is unpopular to do so - both within and outside of the Church. Not content with doing things as they have always been done and unafraid to fail, he will seek out new ways to proclaim and live the Gospel.

Radiating the joy of the Gospel he will be a person of hope and enthusiasm who will seek out the good rather than the bad, who will search for opportunity in the place of inertia, who will model a sense of openness and welcome which will radiate throughout the local church. He will be a leader who will bring the very best out of others. Not only will he read the signs of our times, but he will hear the invitation and challenge of God as spoken through the voice of the poor and the marginalised as well as from the disenfranchised and the committed.

Our Church needs leaders who listen before they speak, who announce rather than denounce, who speak truth to power and who put love of God before loyalty to the institution.

As we await the appointment let us pray for whoever may be asked to serve as Archbishop. He will need all our prayers.
