Reflection

History of Beautiful Belmullet

Since, during this current year of Our Lord, 2024, we should all celebrate the two hundredth anniversary of Beautiful Belmullet as a town, we have decided to include in our bulletin some snippets about the history of Belmullet and its surroundings.

If one turns to the internet and consults that ever knowledgeable personage, Mr Google, one reads that Belmullet (which in the <u>Irish</u> language reads Béal an Mhuirthead, meaning 'mouth of the Mullet [Peninsula]') is a coastal <u>Gaeltacht</u> town with a population of 1,019.

Belmullet is located right at and around that narrow strip of land (known as an isthmus), which links the peninsula that comprises the parish of Kilmore Erris to the mainland.

Belmullet has been described as the commercial and cultural heart of the barony of Erris, which, as a whole, has a population of almost 10,000. In fact, as many will testify, there is a great deal of culture throughout the whole barony of Erris Because of its position at and around the isthmus linking Kilmore Erris and the mainland, Belmullet can boast of possessing two bays, Blacksod Bay to the south and Broadhaven Bay to the north. A canal, which we now call Carter's Canal, runs through the town of Belmullet and connects the two bays.

The origin of the name Belmullet is not altogether clear. It is, therefore, the subject of some speculation and suggestion. One suggestion is that it may have come from Irish Béal Muileat or Béal an Mhuileat, which has been translated as "mouth of the <u>isthmus</u>". Bernard O'Hara in Mayo: Aspects of its Heritage suggests that "A change from 'L' to 'R', which is quite common in Irish, may have given Béal an Mhuireat which in turn became Béal an Mhuirhead". It has also been suggested that the latter half of the town's name (mullet) may refer to <u>the fish</u> which is known as the mullet. Yet another suggestion is that the latter half of the town's name may refer to the <u>star shape used in heraldry</u> since, in English heraldry, a star with straight sided rays is known as a mullet.
