Easter Dues envelopes are now available at the back of the church for those who do not use the envelope system. If you are using the envelopes available at church, and are planning to apply for charity tax rebate, please write your name and envelope number on envelope.

What are Dues Envelopes? The Easter Dues envelopes along with Christmas and Autumn Dues pay the salary of the priest of the parish, diocesan levy (calculated by curate's salary) and contribute to the support of retired clergy, clergy working in offices and clergy in underprivileged areas of the diocese. The current salary for the priest of the diocese is €1,450 per calendar month.

What is the Weekly Offertory Collection for then? It is a common misunderstanding that the weekly offertory collection is for the priest. In actually fact, the weekly offertory collections is for the upkeep and running of the parish. It does not form any part of the priest's income or salary. 

Going to church is not about checking a religious box off your "make God happy" list. It's about being invested in the lives of others. Participating in the mission of the Gospel. Loving and being loved. Following Jesus was never meant to be a solo experience. Pull up a seat at the table. It is a level table and there is room for all of us.

A WORD IN YOUR EAR...

I read a brief news item in an English paper this week that brought a wry smile to my face. The story concerned a council worker who was caught strimming the plastic grass on a Somerset roundabout! An embarrassed local Council official provided the reassurance that 'additional training will be offered'.

The story reminded me of a similar experience I had over forty years ago. On a cold winter's day in the late 1970's I attended a funeral in Drogheda with a fellow Augustinian. The deceased had three sons in Religious Life. So there was a heavy clerical presence at the burial. When the burial ceremony ended, a Christian brother, who had been standing at the edge of the crowd, pushed his way through to sympathise with the grieving widow. But he hadn't allowed for the artificial nature of grass mat that covered the grave. With his consoling hand outstretched towards the widow, he stepped disastrously on the mat and disappeared. My friend and I retired to the pub to regain our composure! Years later, my friend wrote a poem "Today in Mount Jerome" that found echoes with me. He had changed the names, and the location, but the circumstances were unmistakable. The opening verse runs as follows:

Hurrying to offer the widow sympathy
And hoping to escape quickly from the ice on the wind,
Today in Mount Jerome a small fat nun
Stepped on the artificial grass over a grave-mouth
And fell heavily down the opening.

A failure to distinguish what is man-made from what is not, has here a funny side, but arguably it is a failure to respect this distinction which accounts for our present environmental crisis.

The bible story of creation is not of course a scientific hypothesis. It is rather a reflection on the natural world and humanity's place in it.

Many years ago I was taught that the creation of Adam and Eve on the final day of God's activity symbolised that humans are the pinnacle of all creation. And since it is humans who are telling the story, from a human point of view, it would be unsurprising if this were indeed the case. But it seems to me that this take on the story misses something important. After God has got the preliminaries out of the way on the first and second days, making day and night, dry land and deep waters, he turns on days three, four and five to trees and grass, sun, moon and stars, birds and beasts and so on. And on those days we hear the repeated refrain 'And behold God saw that it was good'. There is no suggestion that 'it was good' was exclusive to humans. The refrain is applied to all of creation.

Human invention has, from the very beginning of our history, applied itself to the natural world and adapted it to our ends. But it is only in the most recent period that these human capacities threaten to overwhelm the natural world and leave nothing – not even the highest mountains, the deepest

oceans, – unaffected by our interventions. The determination to turn everything to our purposes threatens to bring about the demise of our species and all our purposes to nothing. Our technological capabilities have vastly expanded, but not the wisdom with which to govern them.

A failure to distinguish plastic grass from the genuine article is one thing; a failure on a bigger scale to respect that and other genuine articles is another. But it might be that, in the latter case, as well as in the former, we all need some retraining - if it's not already too late.



SECURING THE FUTURE

My contention is that it is now the time when the leadership of today's Church, with insight and discernment, with courage and honesty, must take a fresh look at the Christianity it has created over the past two millennia, a Christianity in which we have been brought up and lived all our lives up to this second decade of the first century of the third millennium and consider what needs to be changed, and then change it. Living things that do not change die. Acceptance by the apostles and first disciples in council in the year 49 of the necessity of fundamental change saved the Church from being just a small sect within Judaism and dying out. That gave it its own identity and independent existence, and at that time and until recently it enabled it to take the gospel to almost every nation.








