#### FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

Monday: Sts. Basil the Great and Gregory Nazianzen (bishops & doctors

of the Church). These two close friends were born in the Holy Land in the fourth century. They were monks but were chosen against their wishes to be bishops — Basil in Caesarea and Gregory in

Constantinople. Basil is patron saint of Russia.

Tuesday: St. Munchin. He was born in Dal Cais in the seventh century. He

founded a monastery and church on the site of present-day Limerick.

He is patron saint of Limerick.

#### **FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY:**

Friday (6<sup>th</sup> January) is the Feast of the Epiphany and is a <u>Holyday of Obligation</u>. It is called "little Christmas" and was known in Ireland as Nollaig na mBan (the day when women could relax after the hectic rush of Christmas).

This ancient feast ranks among the principal festivals of the whole liturgical year. It celebrates Jesus born of Mary as the Son of God, the promised Messiah of the Jewish people, and a light to the nations of the world.

In the Orthodox Church the Epiphany was celebrated as the principal feast of the birth of Jesus. Because the Patriarch of the Orthodox Church in Moscow supported Putin in his invasion of Ukraine the Christians of Ukraine have now made Christmas Day the day to celebrate the birth of Jesus.
