MISSION SUNDAY:

This Sunday is Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism, to be missionaries, through prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday this year reflects on the theme: "You Shall be my Witness" He reminds us that, "as Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves," as we "recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel."

As we pray and respond on World Mission Sunday here at home, we share in those celebrations taking place in every parish and school throughout the world. Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions.

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.

The entire Offertory Collection this weekend will be sent to Rome to support the Foreign Missions.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

- Monday:** **St Anthony Mary Claret (1807- 1870).** Archbishop of Santiago.
- Thursday:** **St. Otteran.** He preceded Columba in Iona and his grave is still revered there. He was chosen as patron of Waterford in 1096 and is now patron of the diocese.
- Friday** **Sts. Simon and Jude, apostles.** The teaching of the Apostles is the living gospel for all to hear. St Jude is the patron saint of hopeless cases.
- Saturday:** **St. Colman** was from Kilmacduagh, Co. Clare and lived in the 7th century. He studied in Aran and founded two churches there and another one in Kilmacduagh.
