This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.


right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

The coming of Christ is a message of joy: a joy founded and rooted in God's love and care for his people, and his promise of an eternal companionship.





Everyone's life is a witness to something. Foster and adoptive parents give a child a whole new life, often at great financial and emotional cost to themselves. They bear witness to humanity's compassion and care for others. The doctors and nurses of

Doctors without Borders go into war zones, at great peril to themselves, in order to give new life to those who have been injured in conflict. They witness to the heroic selflessness which lie within human beings. In their lives, they, like John the Baptist, witness to the One who came that "they may have life and have it to the full." Others, perhaps very damaged by their life experiences, who care only for money regardless of the hurt they cause to others, witness to the self-centredness which also lies inside each of us.

Jesus came to show, first Israel, then the whole world, how to live as the People of God. John the Baptist pointed him out when he came, but many rejected Jesus' message of caring and sharing and universal love. Some, especially the religious leaders, also rejected the messenger; John the Baptist, like Jesus, was also put to death.

Today, we are all called to be John the Baptist, witnessing to Jesus' continuing presence in our world with his message of universal love. We may not end up with our head on a plate, but witnessing to Jesus' love for the poor and unwanted can sometimes be seriously detrimental to our popularity!


