Vocation Sunday

By any standard it's an unusual life, in today's world it is may even seem like a strange life, but for me at least it is a great life. My life as a priest is often challenging but always fulfilling, it is occasionally demanding but always satisfying, it is sometimes difficult but always rewarding.

For me priesthood is a life filled with blessing and abounding in joy. It is a life where I am inspired and enriched by the people I meet, a life which is varied and busy, a life which is never mundane or ordinary. I am told that someone once asked one my predecessors, Canon Eamon whether he was ever lonely and he answered that although he was often alone he was never lonely. The same rings true for me. Although I live alone my priesthood brings me into the lives of so many people and their families at times of huge importance for them.

No two days are ever the same. Although daily and weekend Mass provide the regular rhythm of each week, days and weeks will vary according to the time of year or indeed the unpredictability of life; a funeral, a wedding, a baptism, a family crisis, an illness, a bereavement.

This week for example began with First Holy Communion in Newport. What a joy it was to witness and experience the innocent faith of those boys and girls as they made their First Communion, what a privilege it was to get to know those children over the past months. During the week our Confirmation classes went on retreat Ballintubber and the classes were visited in preparation for Mass at the weekend. This week there was a funeral in the parish. Over the days of a funeral the priest journeys with the bereaved. Visits to the home to offer prayers and to arrange the details of the funeral liturgy are moments of grace for both the grieving family and the local community. The funeral Mass itself is a time of healing and comfort for the family and requires some care and thought in its preparation. As it happens there was also a wedding this weekend which meant that we met for a rehearsal on one of the evenings. Then there are the regular meetings

to be attended. This week I had two School Board of Management meetings added to a number of Diocesan meetings. At any one time there are a number of people unwell in the parish and it is always lovely to be in a position to visit them. The week ended with a visit to Clare Island for an overnight stay and Mass on Saturday morning. A busy week but a fulfilling week.

It is the faith of the community which inspires and motivates me as a priest. Yes, there are moments of darkness and doubt, yes there are times when I feel helpless and inadequate but it is always the faith of the people I serve which keeps me going. I may feel helpless but I never feel hopeless. God carries me. Priesthood is a good life. This Sunday, Vocations Sunday, we are invited to pray for Vocations. Can I invite you to pray for the priests you know but also to pray that young men from our community will be inspired to answer the call to priesthood. And maybe don't just pray, encourage.
