In his **Message for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation** Pope Francis begins by noting that, "God wants justice to reign; it is as essential to our life as God's children made in his likeness as water is essential for our physical survival." In 2015, Pope Francis first instituted the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation to encourage prayer for our common home.

Recalling Pope Benedict XVI who once observed how external deserts are growing due to internal deserts that have become so vast, Pope Francis decried the greed and selfishness today that disrupts the planet's water cycle. The threats to our planet and water sources are many, he notes: fossil fuels and the destruction of



forests that contribute to climate change; the depletion and pollution of freshwater sources through extreme practices such as fracking or uncontrolled mega-mining projects and intense animal farming.

Highlighting the Synod on Synodality that will open its first session in October at the end of the Season of Creation, Pope Francis said, "the entire People of God is being invited to an immersive journey of synodal dialogue and conversion."

He concluded, that "our synodal Church must be a source of life for our common home and all its inhabitants...sowing justice and peace in every place it reaches."

"In this Season of Creation, as followers of Christ on our shared synodal journey, let us live, work and pray that our common home will teem with life once again. May the Holy Spirit once more hover over the waters and guide our efforts to 'renew the face of the earth." (Source: Vatican News)

Two Irish Bishops to attend Universal Synodal Assembly in Rome this October

On Friday 7 July, the Vatican published the full list of participants attending the first session of the Universal Synod in Rome this October.

Bishop Brendan Leahy of Limerick and Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ of Raphoe are the two bishops who will be travelling from Ireland to take part in the assembly.

Welcoming the announcement, Bishop Leahy said, "I very much look forward to the gathering in October. I believe the positive engagement and valuable inputs on the part of many in Ireland in the Synodal pathway to date have helped to prepare me. I am thinking of the special atmosphere and spiritual conversations we experienced, for example, at the Athlone gathering in June 2022. I pray that the October assembly will



be a time of going deeper still, in listening together with participants from across the world to what the Spirit is saying to the Church at this time, so often described by Pope Francis as an era of transformation".



Bishop McGuckian SJ said, "I am excited to be a part of an authentic discernment of the Holy Spirit at work in the People of God, as we listen together to the Scriptures and the Church's tradition. We ask for the prayers of all the Faithful for inspiration for all of us who will gather in Rome that this Synod will bring us all closer to Christ and his Saving Love in the world."


Kilfraughaun Cemetery Mass: On a tranquil albeit showery Thursday evening, a heartwarming event unfolded in the ancient cemetery of Kilfraughaun, Cross. Around 70 people gathered to celebrate a mass amidst their ancestors, paying homage to the generations that preceded them Leading the mass, Fr Declan of Cong, Cross & The Neale Parish, shared intriguing insights into the history of Kilfraughaun Cemetery. Explaining that the site which includes the ancient ruins of a tiny church, had been a burial ground for over 1,500 years, he connected the present-day community with the ancient traditions and customs of their ancestors. Fr Declan's words resonated deeply with the attendees, instilling a sense of pride in their shared heritage and emphasising the continuity of life that transcends time.





