Section 1 - General Information

Community and voluntary activism is thriving in Mayo, and it is vital that the services of the many community volunteer groups that work among us, and the valuable impact that this work has on the quality of life of the citizens of County Mayo, is acknowledged publicly.

In recognition of this, Mayo County Council is delighted to invite nominations for the third annual Cathaoirleach's Awards.

I. WHAT ARE THE CATHAOIRLEACH'S AWARDS?

The Cathaoirleach's Awards honour and celebrate the many groups that work quietly behind the scenes to make our communities stronger, more vibrant and caring, often inspiring and motivating others to become actively involved in their communities.

Unsung heroes are to be found in every town, village, street and road in County Mayo. They are of all ages and from all backgrounds, while working across diverse areas of interest, they all share one important characteristic; they give freely and generously of their time to make life better for their communities.

The public nomination process is now open, and we invite you to nominate those whom you would like to be recognised for the work they do.

II. WHAT PRIZES ARE AWARDED?

All winners will be presented with a specially commissioned trophy, hand crafted in Mayo, at the Cathaoirleach's Awards Presentation Evening in early 2024.

Winners will also receive a bursary to use for their community work.

III. HOW DO I MAKE A NOMINATION?

There is one *Nomination Form* for all categories. Please ensure to read this *Information Booklet* carefully before completing the *Nomination Form*.

- Please confirm that you have read our Data Protection Declaration on Page 1.
- Indicate which category you are making the nomination for on Page 2 of the Nomination Form. An individual or Group can be nominated under one category only.
- Information about the group or person being nominated for an award and information about the person or group making the nomination should be entered on Page 3.
- Give your reasons for making the nomination on Pages 4 6.

- Up to 4 high resolution photographs and 1 short video clip can be submitted in support of your nomination.
- The closing date for nominations is Friday, January 12th 2024. Late applications will not be accepted.

Nomination Forms may be submitted by post to the Communications Department, Mayo County Council, Áras an Chontae, Castlebar, Co Mayo F23 WF90, or by email to communications@MayoCoCo.ie no later than Friday, January 12th 2024.

IV. JUDGING/SHORTLISTING:

Nominations will be considered by panels consisting of invited external experts and local authority staff.

All those nominated will be informed in due course if they have been successfully shortlisted in their respective category.

V. ARE THERE ANY TERMS OR CONDITIONS?

There are a few simple conditions:

- Except for the Diaspora Award, nominees should normally live or carry out the activities for which they are being nominated within County Mayo.
- While groups may nominate themselves, self-nominations from individuals will not be accepted.
- Before submitting a nomination, please ensure that you have notified the nominee.
- Nominations will only be considered on the official *Nomination Form*, which must be fully completed, signed by the nominator(s) and submitted by post to the Communications Department, Mayo County Council, Áras an Chontae, Castlebar, Co Mayo F23 WF90 or by email to communications@MayoCoCo.ie no later than Friday, January 12th 2024.
- The Data Protection Declaration on Page 1 of the Nomination Form must be completed.
- Canvassing will disqualify.

Section 2 - AWARD CATEGORIES IN DETAIL

1. MAYO PUBLICATON AWARDS (2 AWARDS)

(Individual and Group Nominees accepted)

This Award is for the best book on any aspect of life in Mayo. Entries may include local heritage and history, biography and autobiography, folklore and traditions, natural history, sport, parish annuals and any other aspect of life in the county. Publications from individuals, organisations and communities are accepted. Fiction, poetry and drama entries are not eligible.

Is féidir iontrálacha a bheith í mBéarla nó í nGaeilge. Entries may be in Irish or in English.

Entries must have been published between the 1st January 2023 and the 31st December 2023.

Two copies of the nominated publication must be submitted with the Nomination Form for consideration.

Separate awards will be made to:

- 1(a) Publications from commercial publishers
- 1(b) Publications from community groups

2. CONTRIBUTION TO LOCAL HERITAGE AND BIODIVERSITY AWARDS (2 AWARDS)

2(a) CONTRIBUTION TO LOCAL HERITAGE AWARD

(Individual and Group Nominees accepted)

This Award recognises the contribution by individuals or groups to the conservation, management, protection or promotion of Mayo's cultural, archaeological or built heritage.

The award recognises:

- Fresh approaches and initiatives that link heritage to communities, promoting active engagement with heritage and its appreciation by the public.
- The application of good heritage practice in managing sites, collections or objects.
- Efforts/activities to ensure the survival of a heritage feature or structure.
- Contribution to heritage knowledge through research or data collection.

Publications will not be considered for this award category.



2(b) CONTRIBUTION TO LOCAL BIODIVERSITY AND NATURAL HERITAGE AWARD

(Individual and Group Nominees accepted)

This Award recognises the contribution by individuals or groups to the conservation, management, protection or promotion of Mayo's biodiversity and natural heritage.

The award recognises:

- Fresh approaches and initiatives that link biodiversity to communities, promoting active engagement with biodiversity and natural heritage and its appreciation by the public.
- The application of good practice in managing biodiversity or natural heritage sites.
- Contribution to biodiversity and natural heritage knowledge through research or data collection.

Publications will not be considered for this award category.

3. CONTRIBUTION TO COMMUNITY LIFE AWARDS (2 AWARDS)

3(a) COMMUNITY ENDEAVOUR AWARD

(Group Nominees only. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

This Award recognises community groups that show initiative, leadership and involvement in projects and activities that embody the spirit of genuine partnership and benefit the overall community.

3(b) COMMUNITY SOCIAL INCLUSION PROJECT AWARD

(Group Nominees only. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

Social Inclusion is about involving everyone within communities and this Award recognises those groups working to strengthen local communities, increase participation and promote social inclusion through their organisation, its activities and events.

4. COMMUNITY TOURISM AWARD

(Group Nominees only. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

The Community Tourism Award seeks to recognise the efforts of voluntary groups or social enterprises in contributing to the development of outstanding experiences for visitors to County Mayo.





The Award will recognise any of the following initiatives that contribute to outstanding visitor experiences or extend the Céad Míle Fáilte in our towns or rural areas:

- Collaborative initiatives between visitor destinations in the County.
- Efforts that support a balanced calendar of annual events/activities.
- New or innovative attractions, activities or festivals.
- Collaboration with tourism and hospitality providers to ensure high-quality integrated visitor service.

5. ENVIRONMENTAL AWARDS (3 AWARDS)

Category A – Green Community of the Year - recognises communities and voluntary organisations that have undertaken initiatives across several environmental themes.

Category B - Environmental Initiatives: Energy and/or Travel - recognises community groups and voluntary organisations who have carried out initiatives to reduce carbon emissions associated with energy use and/or modes of travel within their community.

Category C - Environmental Initiatives: Circular Living – Waste and/or Litter - recognises community groups and voluntary organisations who promote circular living within their communities and/or work to keep their communities' litter free.

Please note applicants can only be nominated in <u>one</u> of the three categories listed above.

Where a community/voluntary organisation is nominated, they must be a member of the Public Participation Network to be eligible for an award. To apply for membership, visit www.mayoppn.ie/join-mayo-ppn

GREEN COMMUNITY OF THE YEAR AWARD

(Group Nominees only. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

This category recognises the overall work that local voluntary groups have done to reduce emissions and improve their local environment under 5 themes: Biodiversity and Natural Habitats, Energy and/or Water Efficiency, Transport, Waste & Circular Economy & Engagement with Community.

ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES: ENERGY AND/OR TRAVEL AWARD

(Group Nominees only. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

This award recognises the best Community Energy and/or Travel initiatives. This category is open to all Community Groups and Voluntary Organisations who have

undertaken initiatives to reduce carbon emissions associated with energy use and/or modes of travel within their community.

ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES: CIRCULAR LIVING - WASTE AND/OR LITTER AWARD

(Group Nominees only. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

This category is open to all Community Groups and Voluntary Organisations who promote circular living within their communities and work to keep their communities' litter free.

Circular living promotes a move away from the 'take, make and waste' model and fosters a culture of reuse, repair, repurpose and waste prevention. In doing so circular living preserves precious natural resources, protects habitats, and reduces pollution.

6. CONTRIBUTION TO THE ARTS AWARD

(Individual and Group Nominees accepted. See 'Tips for Applicants' for further application advice)

This Award recognises the work that local individuals and groups do to encourage and promote the Arts in their community, including those who:

- Take every opportunity to promote the Arts in their community.
- Have been involved in activities and initiatives that stimulate public interest in the Arts.
- Have been involved in activities and initiatives that promote knowledge, appreciation and practice of the Arts.
- Have been involved in activities and initiatives that assist in improving standards in the Arts.

These awards celebrate those who that take every opportunity to promote the Irish Language in Mayo.

This includes individuals and voluntary groups who:

- Organise initiatives, events and festivals that increase the use of the Irish Language.
- Foster awareness and appreciation of the Irish Language in the community.
- Protect the transmission of Irish as a mother tongue.

Separate awards will be made to applicants based:

- (i) In the Gaeltacht.
- (ii) Outside the Gaeltacht.

8. CONTRIBUTION TO DIASPORA WELLBEING/ ENGAGEMENT AWARD (Individual and Group Nominees accepted)

This Award celebrates those individuals /groups who have made a significant difference in Mayo Irish communities around the world. There are so many people of Mayo ancestry in the worldwide Diaspora who deserve to be recognised in the county of their ancestors and this award looks to acknowledge the achievements of those individuals /groups.

The Cathaoirleach's Award for contribution to Diaspora Wellbeing/Engagement provides an opportunity to nominate a person /group who has achieved something special and to acknowledge their hard work and dedication, which may otherwise go unnoticed. This award is a great way of fostering relationships with our Diaspora around the world.

The nominees for this Award would be sought from Mayo Associations, but any person or group can nominate.



Section 3 - TIPS FOR APPLICANTS

CONTRIBUTION TO LOCAL HERITAGE AND BIODIVERSITY AWARDS (2 AWARDS)

(Group and Individual Nominees accepted)

This category recognises the efforts and achievements of individuals or groups in conserving, managing, protecting and/or promoting built, cultural and natural heritage and biodiversity in their local community.

Our heritage is what we have inherited from the past, to value and enjoy in the present, and to preserve and pass on to future generations. It comprises: **the tangible** – our historical sites, buildings, monuments, objects in museums, artefacts and archives; **the natural** – our rivers and lakes, landscapes, woodlands, bogs, uplands, native wildlife, insects, plants, trees, birds and animals; and **the intangible** – including our customs, sports, folklore, crafts, skills and traditions.

Nominations can be submitted by members of a Heritage or Biodiversity group or a member of the public can nominate a Heritage or Biodiversity group or individual.

Please consider the following before making a nomination:

 When nominating an individual or group, please ensure they have been notified and agree to the nomination before you submit the nomination form.

Describe the work they have done to conserve and promote heritage or biodiversity in the community.

COMMUNITY ENDEAVOUR AWARD

This Award recognises community groups that show initiative, leadership, and involvement in projects and activities that embody the spirit of genuine partnership and benefit the overall community. Only groups are eligible to apply.

COMMUNITY TOURISM AWARD

The Community Tourism Award seeks to recognise the efforts of voluntary groups or social enterprises in contributing to the development of outstanding experiences for visitors to County Mayo.

The Award will recognise any of the following:

- Initiatives that contribute to outstanding visitor experiences or extend the Céad Míle Fáilte in our towns or rural areas. This could include town or village, ambassadors, enhanced visitor orientation services, new tourism product offerings, etc.
- Collaborative initiatives between visitor destinations in the County, including cross selling initiatives, county wide product development, marketing and promotion.
- A balanced calendar of annual events/activities which should have a particular focus on events held in the off and/or shoulder seasons.

Collaboration with tourism and hospitality providers to ensure a high-quality integrated visitor service. Collaborative initiatives could include cross selling, bundling of products for ease of use, enhanced experiences and value for money.



ENVIRONMENTAL AWARDS (3 AWARDS)

Where a community/voluntary organisation is nominated, they must be a member of the Public Participation Network to be eligible for an award. To apply for membership, visit www.mayoppn.ie/join-mayo-ppn

GREEN COMMUNITY OF THE YEAR AWARD

(Group Nominees only)

This category recognises the overall work that local voluntary groups have done to reduce emissions and improve their local environment under 5 themes: Biodiversity and Natural Habitats, Energy and/or Water Efficiency, Transport, Waste & Circular Economy & Engagement with community.

When completing your application please consider the 5 headings below and explain what you have achieved so far, **particularly over the last 12 months**. Please write a max of 250 words per heading:

- Biodiversity and Natural Habitats Describe any activities your community group has recently taken to conserve biodiversity, use biological resources sustainably, improve natural habitats.
- II. **Energy and/or Water Efficiency** Describe the steps your community group has taken to improve energy efficiency and/or water efficiency.
- III. **Transport** Describe any sustainable transport initiatives your organisation has taken, e.g., to reduce congestion, to green your fleet, or any other actions that result in fuel savings, CO2 emission reduction.
- IV. Waste & Circular Economy Describe the steps taken to reduce waste within your community.
- V. **Engagement with community** Outline the impacts on engagement with the wider community

ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES: ENERGY AND/OR TRAVEL AWARD (Group Nominees only)

This award recognises the best Community Energy and/or Travel initiatives. This category is open to all community groups and voluntary organisations who have undertaken initiatives to reduce carbon emissions associated with energy use and/or modes of travel within their community.

Please consider the following when making your nomination:

- Reduction of reliance on fossil fuels/ Saving on CO2 emissions
- Innovation
- Replicability/Scalability of project
- Community impact (e.g., Affecting behavioural change/ Educational campaigns)





• Other co-benefits. (e.g., Increased biodiversity/health benefits/improved quality of life, etc.) as a result of the project.

Examples of projects include, but are not limited to:

- Small community renewable energy projects (solar, hydro, wind)
- Retrofitting of community buildings
- Improved cycle/walk ways, bike parking
- Community electric vehicles/bikes
- Energy/Transport Awareness events

ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES: CIRCULAR LIVING – WASTE AND/OR LITTER AWARD

(Group Nominees only)

This category is open to all Community Groups and Voluntary Organisations who promote circular living within their communities and/or work to keep their communities' litter free.

Please consider the following when making your nomination:

Litter Management Initiatives:

- Efforts made in relation to general upkeep and litter control such as routine or seasonal litter picks.
- Awareness campaigns ran locally relating to various common litter sources.
- Use of anti-litter awareness materials from Mywaste.ie such as 'your country your waste' and 'butts belong in bins'
- Engagement with householders, schools, businesses, and other organisations in relation to litter awareness/litter control.
- Participation in litter campaigns such as national spring clean or 2 minute beach clean.

Waste Management Initiatives:

- Promotion of good waste management locally using community events/talks.
- Promotion and use of information and assets from mywaste.ie such as bin labels, posters and social media resources.

Circular Living Initiatives:

- Promotion of local or national reuse online platforms such as zero waste or repair my stuff.
- Events and schemes to encourage swapping & reuse of items.
- Promotion of local repair services.
- Upcycling/repurposing projects locally.
- Work done to reduce food waste.
- Local composting schemes or promotion of home composting.





 Any other schemes locally that encourages keeping items in circulation as long as possible.

CONTRIBUTION TO THE ARTS IN MAYO AWARD

This category recognises the work that local individuals and groups have done to encourage and promote the Arts in their community.

Nominations can be submitted by members of an Arts group or a member of the public can nominate an Arts group or individual.

Please consider the following before making a nomination:

- Please ensure that the individual/group have been notified and agree to the nomination before you submit the nomination form.
- Describe the work they have done to encourage and promote arts in the community.
- Don't assume the judging panel will be familiar with the work of any individual or group. Give some background information including examples of previous and current work and achievements and samples to support this.
- Outline the difference the individual or group make to the arts and their local communities, how their work meets the criteria of the award and the reasons why they deserve the award.

CONTRIBUTION TO DIASPORA WELLBEING/ ENGAGEMENT

(Individual and Group Nominees accepted)

This category recognises the work and achievements that individuals /groups have done to contribute to furthering the ideals and wellbeing of Mayo people or causes overseas.

The nominees for this Award should be sought from Mayo Associations, but any person or group can nominate.

Please consider the following before making a nomination:

- Describe the work they have done to contribute to furthering the ideals and wellbeing of Mayo people or causes overseas.
- Don't assume the judging panel will be familiar with the work of any individual or group. Give some background information including examples of previous and current work and achievements and samples to support this.
- Outline the difference the individual or group make to their local communities, how their work meets the criteria of the award and the reasons why they deserve the award.
