We come in thanks to God for his presence and care in our lives. The gospel is an invitation from Jesus to give thanks. If we think over all we can be thankful for, we often find more than we realised.





Nine were cured, and one was cured and healed!

Something about Jesus brought these sick people to him. They had heard of him and hoped for a cure. He gave more than a cure; he offered an interior healing.

Jesus healed just by being who he was. His power to heal met the faith of the man or woman who came to him. He saw people as needing healing, without asking why. Pope Francis thinks of the church first as a sort of field hospital, being present for people ready to lend a helping hand or a listening ear.

One of the greatest needs today is to be heard. Often all we really need is to be heard. Even when someone drives you mad, maybe then they need to be heard. Listening can be healing – both for the speaker and the listener. The lepers in the Gospel today were outcasts – they cried out from a distance. They needed Jesus to hear them and take pity on them.

There is another part to this Gospel – the act of giving thanks. Only one among them remembers to give thanks. Pope Francis in his homily for this day in 2019 reminds us that being thankful is an expression of our faith: "A grateful heart is one that remains young. To say "Thank you, Lord" when we wake up, throughout the day and before going to bed: that is the best way to keep our hearts young..."

Jesus embraced the people whom nobody wanted. He cured with compassion. Our challenge is to be compassionate when helping others. Like Jesus, we try to look others in the eye with love and care before asking anything of them, to bring mercy, healing and a listening ear to the cares of people and of the world. This is sharing in the saving mission of Jesus.

As you heal and strengthen me, o Lord, may I do the same for others.

BISHOPS' CONFERENCE: The Autumn General Meeting of the Irish Bishops' Conference took place this week in Maynooth, where issues of global environmental deterioration, sustainable ecology and the challenge to achieve climate justice for the poorest of humanity were discussed. In praying for all those affected by climate change, Bishops reiterated the consistent call of Pope Francis that economic systems must not be based on short-term profits, but rather ought to serve the common good of present and future generations. In acknowledging the current fuel crisis, the Bishops stated that no one in Ireland should suffer from fuel poverty this Winter. They also recognised that, into the future, the current fuel crisis offers an opportunity to reduce dependency on fossil fuels.
