PARISH NEWS:

FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING:

The Cross is a throne and the Man hanging there is a King. The King is Christ who knows all earthly values inside out. He is a King not through wealth or reputation but because he is a Man of compassion, of mercy, of justice brought to death. He is King of creation and Son of God. We hope to spend eternity with Christ our King. Can we not spend a little time with him here in the Blessed Sacrament?.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK:

- Monday: The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It has been believed from the earliest times that Mary was presented in the Temple in Jerusalem and reared there. This event symbolises her total dedication to God.
- **Tuesday; St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr.** She was a Roman lady of the third century who founded a church in Rome. According to legend she sang to God before her execution. For that reason she was chosen as patroness of musicians.
- Wednesday: St. Columban, abbot & missionary. He was born about 543. He became a monk in Bangor but desiring 'to go on pilgrimage for Christ' he left with twelve other monks and came to Burgundy. He established many monasteries according to the severe Irish rule. He also founded a monastery in Austria and his most famous at Bobbio, near Genoa, where he died in 615.
- **Thursday:** St. Andrew Dung-Lac, priest and Companions, martyrs. These Christians were martyred in Vietnam in the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries.
- Friday: St. Colman, bishop. He was born in west Cork around 530. He was a bard but was influenced by St. Brendan to become a priest. He is the patron saint of Cloyne diocese.

ADVENT:

Next Sunday (27th November) is the First Sunday of Advent and the first day in the Church's new liturgical year. The season of Advent is dedicated to the Last Things (death, judgement, heaven, hell). Above all it is a period of preparation to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas.
