

MARY DELIA MULLIN, GLENCORRIB - RIP:

With a heavy heart, we remember with a prayer a good neighbour, friend and community lady Mary Delia Mullin whose funeral took place in Glencorrib Church last weekend. A wonderful lady who will be always remembered for her kindness to all she met, her generosity with her time and was constantly giving and never asking for anything in return. Many will remember her days in PCH, Headford where she worked and taught Irish and History to hundreds of students. She will be remembered for her kindness, encouragement, concern and welfare that she had for her pupils. She was a great listener. I don't think she could give out to a rowdy student in fact she would try and win them over to her kind of thinking by being respectful and kind to them.



In the past decade or so, following retirement, herself and Paschal were seldom apart. They were always together like Salt & Pepper. Where you saw one you saw the other. She loved spending time with the family and adored all her grandchildren. Every visitor always got a great welcome at Mullins. I got to know Mary Delia when we started researching the history of Glencorrib NS 1854-2004 book. She was a joy to work with for the year or so it took to put the book together. For Mary no history book would be complete without trips to the National Archives in Dublin and the County Library in Castlebar. Not only did she read about the history of the parish, she also wrote several historical articles on Moyne Cemetery, the local castles, churches and chapels and in particular the Glencorrib Lisheen (Children's burial ground) on the Ballynalty Road where she served on the committee that organised a stone plague at the entrance of the Lisheen to commemorate the importance of remembering our past. She served on the Board of Management of Glencorrib NS for many years. But she is best remembered a being one of the main organizers of the Millennium Book of photos. This album contains photos taken in the year 2000 of all the families in Glencorrib and Kilroe communities. It also contains photos of major events in that same year. For many years she provided bowls of Shamrock for the congregations at both Glencorrib and Shrule Churches on St. Patrick's Day. She was the first Eucharistic Minister in Glencorrib Church. She enjoyed being on stage and took part in many plays in Glencorrib Hall. She enjoyed baking and dressmaking and was excellent at both. In fact she made her own wedding dress.

On rip.ie she is remembered with words like caring, compassion, kindness, friendliness, helping, always giving, full of good humour, warmth, generosity, welcoming, beautiful smile, always saw the good in a person and truly unique lady. She passed away on Tuesday 27th September, the feastday of St Vincent de Paul. A saint and organization recognized for giving and helping those in need. A virtue that Mary Delia herself possessed. Like a mother to us all. Please keep her husband Paschal, children Annette, Noel, John, Bernadette and extended family in your thoughts and prayers. Mary Delia RIP

She had a wonderful smile and was always easy to chat too. She could talk about any topic yet didn't impose her ideas on you. She listened. Joyce's Supermarket in Headford was always a good place to bump into Patsy. She'd be rushing around the shop with maybe a few of the grandchildren but she would always stop for a chat. We will always remember her for that. Patsy was a keen gardener and always had a beautiful garden. She enjoyed the closeness with nature and she passed away on the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi the patron saint of nature and the environment. She was a lady who looked after herself and always dressed well. She absolutely loved the dance floor and was a very talented dancer. Covid stopped a lot of the social dancing but she was ready to hit the dance floors again when the dances returned.

Patsy has no regrets other than leaving this world and her heart broken family much too soon. She was a good woman, a great Mass goer along with her grandchildren. She was exemplary really. Representing all that was good and she gave so much. WEEKEND MASS SCHEDULE REVIEW

Over the next number of weeks, there will be a count will be taken of numbers attending weekend Masses. Currently, there are 4 Masses celebrated at the weekend – Saturday vigils 6:30pm Glencorrib and



8pm Shrule and on Sunday 9:30am Glencorrib and 11am Shrule. It is no longer possible to ignore the low attendance at some of the Masses as well as the challenges in getting volunteers. Over the next number of weeks there will be a review if this number of Mass are any longer necessary. The primary way in which this will be explored is gauging the level of attendance at each Mass, and if there are sustainable numbers to justify scheduling Mass at that time. This would mean a Mass or Masses no longer be scheduled, with relevant Mass intentions transferred to other Masses.

CHY3 TAX REBATE FORMS.

Over the next few weeks, parishioners who have contributed over €250 in any given year over the last 4 years will



receive a CHY3 form in the post. The CHY3 form covers a 5-year period of contributions. You are invited to complete this form if you are a taxpayer and return it. This form will allow the parish to benefit from a tax rebate on the total sum paid in any given year. This money will go toward the ongoing works currently underway in both churches. What are Dues Envelopes?: The Autumn Dues envelopes along with Christmas and Autumn Dues pay the salary of the priest of the parish, diocesan levy (calculated by curates salary) and contribute to the support of retired clergy, clergy working in offices and clergy in underprivileged areas of the diocese. The current salary for the priest of the diocese is €1450 per calendar month.

What is the Weekly Offertory Collection for then?

It is a common misunderstanding that the weekly offertory collection is for the priest. In actually fact, the weekly offertory collections is for the upkeep & running of the parish. 

Friday last 7th October was National Potato day in Ireland. The potato was not native to Ireland. It had been found by Spanish conquistadors in South America in the 1500s.

In 1589, Sir Walter Raleigh, a British explorer and historian known for his expeditions to the Americas, first brought the potato to Ireland and planted them at his Irish estate at Myrtle Grove, Youghal, near Cork.

For the next 80 years it was grown in small numbers, mainly in Munster, as a garden crop or a supplement. Farmers found that potatoes could grow double the food in the same land. They also realized that if they planted some of their land with potatoes, they would have enough to eat, and still have land to grow oats or engage in dairying. This surplus could then be sold, allowing farmers to make money.

By 1750, the potato had acclimatized to the Irish growing conditions and spread into Connaught where the lazy-bed was invented and into Leinster, where it became the main food for farm labourers.
