

form of mental illness. Many have been homeless on admission and will be homeless again on release. Many of those who go in and out of prison ("lifers by instalment!") feel trapped in their lifestyle. As one said: "Life outside prison is the same as life inside prison, except there are no bars." Many want to escape but need help to do so. For many, that help will never come.



On one of my prison visits, I met with nine prisoners for over an Focus + hour. On reflection afterwards, six of them were known to me to have been sexually abused as children; the other three I did not know them well enough to say. Before they made other people victims of their crimes, they themselves had been victims of serious crimes. This is not to excuse their crimes, which can often leave their victims traumatised, but it seeks to explain them. Understanding why people commit crime is necessary if we want to reduce crime. We often think of prison as full of dangerous people who have committed serious crimes. And some are. But over 80% of those who go to prison are sentenced to less than 12 months. Over 70% have an addiction, and over 50% suffer some


