#### Dear Friends,

The Parish Pastoral Council met during the week to consider the Government easing the Covid-19 restriction and guidance received from the Diocesan Office.

The Pastoral Council reflected upon the information we received and discussed how best to proceed for our Parish of Attymass.

### **Church seating:**

- 1. **Weekend Masses:** It was felt that the best approach for us would be to open fully (no ribbons) a section of the church and to leave another section of the Church with ribbons on every second seat. This allows parishioners to freely choose where they want to sit in church. This will be reviewed regularly.
- 2. **Funeral Masses:** All ribbons will be removed for a funeral Mass

#### **Face Masks & Hand Sanitisers:**

- 1. **Hand Sanitiser:** Parishioners are still being asked to please sanitise your hands as you enter and leave the church.
- 2. **Face Masks:** Face masks still have to be worn in places of worship until the Government review at the end of February.

#### **Funerals:**

Sympathising at funerals in the Church is still not allowed by direction of the Diocesan Office.

#### Parking in the Church Yard:

Parking in the church yard is to be reserved for parishioners with mobility issues at the weekend Masses and daily Mass.

#### **Holy Communion:**

For Holy Communion, parishioners will be asked to come out seat by seat and Holy Communion will be distributed into the hand only.

#### **Parish Office:**

The Parish Office will be open on Tuesdays and Fridays from 11am-1pm. People are asked to a make an appointment for the booking of weddings and baptisms. The Parish Office is closed Saturday and Sunday.

Readers are allowed to return at weekend Masses
