

An Invitation from Bishop Paul

It lifts the heart to hear the hope filled comments dotted through our conversations these days. "There's a great stretch in the evenings," "the daffodils are appearing," "Spring is in the air!" The signs of new life awaken a sense of wonder. This sense of awakening is also happening in the life of the Church as we embark upon a new journey together. Last October, Pope Francis initiated what is called a "Synodal Journey." This is an invitation from the Pope to each member of the Church to share their thoughts on what they believe is truly important in the life of the Church today. "Synod" is a Greek word which literally means "journeying together." This "journeying together" is a wonderful expression of what it is to be Church and is at the heart of Pope Francis' vision of how we should live our lives as brothers and sisters in Christ. As all members of the Church engage with this process of sharing, reflecting and listening it will enable us to discern where the Holy Spirit is calling us as a community of disciples today and into the future.

One central aspect of this process is the ability to listen to one another. In the past synods were mainly the business of bishops and cardinals. However, the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) emphasised that all the baptised make up the People of God and that the Holy Spirit speaks through all those who are baptised. This understanding is at the heart of Pope Francis' ministry; therefore, he wants to listen to what people have to say to the Church today. To do this, a consultation process has been put in place. Every diocese across the world has been asked to reach out to as many people as possible to ask what they would like to say to the Church. This process is now underway in our diocese. When the information is gathered, a report will be drawn up. This feedback will form part of an overall report that will come from all the other dioceses in Ireland and will then be submitted to Rome so that it will be included in the discussions at the Synod in October 2023.

In order for us to reach out to as many people as possible, I asked members of the Diocesan Leadership Team to put together some questions for people to reflect upon. These questions are now available in printed form in your parish and on our Diocesan Website: achonrydiocese.org. I am inviting you to take these questions and reflect upon them. You might also wish to share them with members of your family or friends who have perhaps drifted away or indeed deliberately walked away from the Church. Pope Francis is eager to hear their input too. For practical purposes, each parish will collect the feedback and forward it to Bishop's House. We will also arrange a number of meetings throughout the diocese in the coming weeks where people can come along and share their views on the Church today.

I thank you for taking the time to consider the questions. I pray that through this process we will be able to discern the path the Holy Spirit is calling the Church today and that we will have the courage to respond.
