The Guru's Cat

Not many people noticed, but I did. From my vantage point I had the best view.

It was just after Communion when I first spotted him – a little cat making its way up the centre aisle of Newport Church during Sunday Mass! At first it seemed unperturbed by the praying congregation but the further it came into the church the more wary it became. Finally the little cat darted into the pews before quickly re-emerging and scuttling back out through the main door from whence it had entered. Gone but not forgotten.

What had brought the timid little cat into a vast crowded church? Was it in search of a faith community or little spiritual comfort or maybe even a church mouse? Was it disappointed by what it found or perhaps by what it didn't find? Will it come back? We will have to wait and see.

The arrival of our church cat brought to mind another church cat; 'The Guru's Cat'. *The Guru's Cat* is a short allegorical story written by the famous Indian Jesuit priest, Anthony de Mello:

'When the Guru sat down to worship each evening the church cat would get in the way and distract the worshippers. So the Guru ordered that the cat be tied during evening worship.

After the Guru died, the cat continued to be tied up during evening worship. And when the cat died, another cat was brought to the church so that it could be duly tied during evening worship.

Centuries later, learned treatises were written by the Guru's scholarly disciples on the liturgical significance of tying up a cat while worship is performed.'

De Mello's simple story is for all of us. The story of the guru's cat is an encouragement and an invitation to review what we do habitually and to ask: Why do we do what we do? Why do we say what we say? Why do we use what we use? Is what we're doing still appropriate and beneficial today? Is what we're doing on a daily basis still achieving what it was originally intended to do? Or is it perhaps becoming a distraction, clutter, confusion ... another guru's cat?

As a parish faith community and as individuals it is important that we do not get too obsessed with the repetition of what we have always done without asking why we are doing it? Why expect, even assume, a vibrant parish community if we are not prepared to help sustain and build it? Why present our children for the sacraments if faith is not important in our home? Why keep and maintain our lovely churches if we do not visit them as sacred places. It can and does happen that we get so caught up on the externals that we lose sight of the essentials. What are the essentials of our faith?

Our little feline visitor came and went almost unnoticed. Unlike the Guru's cat it is gone, but it has left us with some questions!
